The Khmer Rouge Tribunal (ECCC) in Phnom Penh is preparing for a second trial against four top surviving leaders of the Khmer Rouge: Nuon Chea, Ieng Sary, Ieng Thirith, and Khieu Samphan. Come learn about the upcoming trial and meet the attorneys representing the ASRIC civil parties in Case002. There will be presentations on the Tribunal as well as a discussion about reparations, i.e., what the Cambodian community in the United States hopes to learn and gain from the trial. **We welcome community members to bring any mementos or photos of your story of survival during and after the Khmer Rouge.** This is an opportunity for the Cambodian community to get together and share their stories of survival with one another as well as an opportunity to voice any questions or concerns about the upcoming trial with attorneys working before the Tribunal.

- 12:30 – 1:30:** Introductions by community leaders, open dialogue and shared stories with survivors
- 1:30 – 2:00:** Closing remarks and final questions and answers

This event is free and open to the public. Civil parties may remain after the event to speak directly with their attorneys. The event will be conducted in English with simultaneous translation in Khmer.
