



# CAMBODIAN DIASPORA VICTIMS' PARTICIPATION PROJECT

**Thirty-four years have passed**, and THIS may be YOUR **ONLY** opportunity to participate in the trials against those allegedly most responsible for the atrocities committed during the Khmer Rouge period (April 17 1975 through January 6, 1979).

If YOU or a family member were a victim of those crimes, YOU have the right to file a complaint, but it must be submitted before the trial begins for it to be used in the trial (tentative deadline, June 2009).

ASRIC in partnership with A/P/A Institute at New York University will provide assistance and information to those who want to file the complaint form for YOUR complaints to be considered.
